Contractual partners for the management of environmentally harmful waste

On changes in tariffs for the management of environmentally harmful goods

Since concluding the agreement on the management of environmentally harmful waste (hereinafter referred to as VKPA), we have successfully cooperated – Latvijas Zaļais punkts (LZP) **has fulfilled the state-mandated environmentally harmful waste regeneration standards on behalf of your company, while your company has received a 100% exemption** from the natural resources tax on environmentally harmful goods.

Considering that LZP management fees are calculated based on VKPA management costs, we would like to inform you that, based on the agreement on the management of environmentally harmful waste concluded between your company and LZP, **from January 1, 2026, LZP will apply the following fees to your company for the management of this type of environmentally harmful goods:**

The increase in fees is related to the increase in production costs for the following reasons:

- Several important provisions of the new European Union Battery Regulation No. 2023/1542, adopted on July 12, 2023, entered into force on August 18, 2025. Among

other things, they establish a new classification of batteries according to their type of use, stricter and broader obligations for operators regarding the collection and recycling of used batteries, including the recovery of various metals from batteries, as well as public education.

- - LZP partners have announced an average increase of 5-8% in the collection and recycling fees for environmentally harmful goods.
- - The fee for maintaining the separate collection infrastructure (70 sorting sites) throughout all municipalities in Latvia, which is a mandatory element of the management system, has also increased by an average of 5%.

We will inform you about changes in the list and reporting forms after the amendments have been approved in the relevant regulatory acts.

Section 6.1(6) of the Natural Resources Tax Act stipulates that, in order to ensure the functioning of the extended producer responsibility system, the producer of goods shall bear the costs of managing the relevant type of waste, including the separate collection, sorting, recycling and recovery, in order to achieve the objectives set out in the regulatory enactments on waste management.
